MDA Awards Small Municipalities and Limited Population County Grants for 54 Projects in Mississippi

MDA's Community Services Division recently awarded **Small Municipalities and Limited Population County Grant (SMPLC) Program** funds for **54** improvement projects throughout Mississippi. The **SMLPC Grant Program** provides funding for community-based projects and counties to assist with public facilities and infrastructure needs. The awards, which total over \$5 million, include:
